



Powerline Technician Fundamentals

Air Ronge, SK

Program Overview

This nine-week program will train committed individuals the basic skills and fundamentals needed to become successful powerline technicians. Students will engage in a mathematics refresher course, physical fitness boot camp, pole climbing, and skills training.

Applicants must:

- be capable of working at heights of nine meters to over 36.5 meters while on poles or towers, as well as working in confined spaces
- be able to meet the challenges of physically demanding work in all types of weather
- be prepared to work with high voltage energized lines, while adhering to established safety procedures
- have accurate colour perception
- have basic mathematical skills
- be prepared to undergo drug testing

Accepted applicants may be required to provide:

- evidence of a Criminal Record Check

Note: A positive result on the CRC may result in the loss of your accepted seat. Students must meet the minimum CRC criteria set out by the practicum agency.

Saskatchewan Apprenticeship & Trades Certification Commission credential eligible.

Entrance Requirements

- Grade 12 diploma
- valid Class 5 driver's licence

Qualified candidates will be required to participate in an intake interview prior to selection.

Accepted applicants will be required to undergo drug testing prior to registration. Failure to pass this check will result in the loss of your seat.
